


THE WORKSHEET

- What it is and what it isn't

- You have to have input
- Manage expectations from the first inquiry
- Discuss timing when you first speak or meet
- Touch base during the planning process
- Can you get them to let you craft the first draft?
- Dealing with coordinators
- Don't get stuck in a bad situation!

THE FIRST LOOK

- Discuss this well before the wedding day
- I talk about it in my first meeting or phone call
- Do you want to push them into it?
- Letting your personal feelings cloud your judgment
- Managing expectations
- How will doing (or not doing!) a first look affect the schedule?



<u>PROS</u>:

- More time for portraits
- You can go to more locations for their portraits
- They get to go to all of cocktail hour
- Will be more relaxed at the ceremony

FRST LOIKE PROSECONS CONS:

- If prep runs late, you lose that time and client's don't understand why
- You cannot go to multiple locations if you're running late
- They have to get dressed much earlier
- Won't get to see each other in the aisle



- Example : Orthodox Jewish wedding
- What do you need to know? Ask!

How will any religions traditions affect the timing

- **Example : Ketubah signing at a Jewish ceremony**
- **Example : Hour-long ceremony at an Indian**

SECOND SHOOTER

- Do you need one?
- Moments when you need another viewpoint : groom prep, bride down the aisle, cocktail hour, multiple angles of the ceremony and reception
- What are their responsibilities?
- How can you handle it solo?
- Can an assistant do double duty?



AN ASSISTANT

- Do you need an assistant?
- Helping arrange family formals
- Holding a light
- Managing the gear
- Managing everything else : batteries, parking the car, running interference with other vendors
- I find an assistant to be essential
