"SOMETHING OLD" is nothing new at a wedding. But when two design buffs recycle found objects for their nuptials in fresh and incandescent ways, well, that's something altogether different. The pair, who met through friends in 2003, wanted their day to "be pure joy, not stuffy"—but without sacrificing luxury, says Jeremy. The result, an every-detail-counts affair that blended haute elements (gourmet food) with down-home whimsy (a Dukes of Hazzard-themed table), was just that.

"Pooch of honor" Bosley sports a custom seersucker suit. The "photo" table holds vintage View-Master discs, slide carousels, wooden frames, and a classic camera; larkspur, peach roses, scabiosa seed heads, and craspedia shoot out of the centerpiece's wheat-grass base.
